Please adhere to the age requirements set for each activity. Activities are open to all youth. Classes are filled on a first-come, first-serve basis beginning registration day. Refunds will only be made if 4-H cancels your class.

To register for 4-H Summer Fun you will need to complete several forms. Forms can be found online (listed below) or picked up at the 4-H Office. We have a free notary on staff.

Sign-up will begin ONLINE at 9:00 am on Monday, May 22, 2017.

No early registration is allowed. You will register each child separately online this year. Our system will "timestamp" your entries and we will go by our OFFICIAL timestamp. If for some reason, you believe you have entered a child and it did not come through the system we are sorry but will have to abide by the "timestamp" on our form. When the program is "CLOSED" you may contact the 4-H office, 336-694-4158, to place your child on the waiting list.

***This is a new process so please bear with us. We will try to make everything as simple as possible. If you do not have access to the internet you can use the Gunn Memorial Public Library's computers located at 161 Main St. in Yanceyville at no-cost.

Please check the email you used during registration for your registration confirmation.

After online registration is complete all forms and payment are due in the office within seven (7) days of registration. If your complete payment and paperwork are not received in 7 days you will your registration will no longer be valid and you will be moved to the back of the list.

Checks should be made payable to Caswell County.

If your child is unable to attend a class after they have signed up, please let our office know as soon as possible, many of our classes have waiting lists. If you have any questions, call the 4-H Office at 336-694-4158.

Safe Sitter is a class that will teach youth how to be a better babysitter. The program is a medically accurate program that teaches youth ages 11 - 14 how to handle emergencies when caring for younger children. During the class, students get hands-on practice in basic lifesaving techniques so they are prepared to act in a crisis. To successfully complete the program, students must pass a rigorous practical and written test to show that they have mastered the key concepts and have the skills necessary to handle an emergency. **Note: Bring a bag lunch each day. **There will be an extra form to fill out at sign-up.**

This course certifies anyone between the ages of 14 and 16 to operate a personal watercraft in North Carolina. The NC General Statutes require that anyone between the ages of 14 and 16 years of age complete a NASBLA approved Boater Education Course in order to operate personal watercraft (PWC) on the waters of this state.
